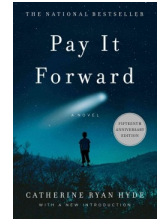

January 13 **Wild: From Lost to Found on the Pacific Crest Trail** by Cheryl Strayed

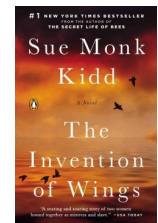
February 10 **Pay It Forward** by Catherine Ryan Hyde

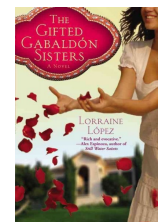
March 9 **Invention of Wings** by Sue Monk Kidd

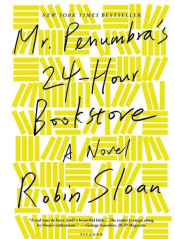
April 13 **Gifted Gabaldón Sisters** by Lorraine M. López
